

How to Host a School Movie Night

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1. Venue

You'll need a place to show your movie that has enough seating for all your guests and a spot large enough for a screen. Your school's auditorium is a good option for a large crowd. Or consider hosting your event outdoors if the weather permits.

2. Licensing

Before you can start picking the movie for your screening, you need to make sure your school has the correct licensing. Screening movies to a public audience will require a license to avoid copyright infringement. Your school can secure a one-time license to show a public movie once or a blanket license that allows you to screen a new movie each week.

3. Promotion

Once you have your venue decided upon and you know which movie you'll be showing, your school will need to promote the event. Flyers and emails are great ways to spread the word about the movie night. In your promotional materials, make sure to let parents know all the details of the event, including the date and time, movie that will be shown, and items they need to bring (blankets, chairs, snacks, etc.).

4. Fundraising

Another thing to consider when planning your movie night is whether it will be used to raise funds for the feminism club. Make sure to include fundraising information on all promotional materials so parents know who will benefit from the event's proceeds.
